FEMA Disaster Declaration for the The State of West Virginia

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has amended its original Disaster Declaration for the state of West Virginia to include two (2) additional cities due to severe storms, flooding, landslides, and mudslides.

Declaration Date: June 25, 2016

Incident Period: June 22, 2016, and continuing

Designated Counties: Clay, Fayette, Greenbrier, Jackson, Kanawha, Lincoln, Nicholas, Monroe,

Pocahontas, Roane, Summers and Webster counties

If the subject property is located in one of the designated counties above and the appraisal was completed on or before June 22, 2016, Planet Home Lending will require one of the following:

- An Appraisal Update and/or Completion Report (Fannie Mae Form 1004D), or
- A Desktop Underwriter Property Inspection Report (Fannie Mae Form 2075).

If the subject property is located in one of the designated counties above and <u>not</u> affected by the disaster, PHL will accept a certification, which must include post-disaster photos that demonstrate that the property has not been adversely affected by the disaster.

The certification cannot be executed by an employee that receives direct compensation from the subject transaction.

A 2075 is also required on the following:

- A DU Refi Plus transaction with a property inspection waiver (PIW).
- An FHA Streamline without an appraisal.

In the event significant damage is indicated on the 1004D or 2075 additional conditions may apply.

Appraisals completed after the Disaster Declaration incident period end date require the appraiser to comment on the value and marketability of the subject property for 60 days from the end of the incident period.
